WHAT IS A MICROBREWERY?

The term originated in the United Kingdom in the late 1970s to describe the new generation of small breweries which focused on producing traditional cask ale. Although originally “microbrewery” was used in relation to the size of breweries, it gradually came to reflect an alternative attitude and approach to brewing which allows for experimentation of new recipes and flavours and the ability to produce a wide selection of different beers from one small brewery. Micro or craft breweries have adopted a marketing strategy different from that of large, mass-market breweries, offering products that compete on the basis of quality and diversity, instead of low price and advertising. They allow the beer to speak for itself – variety is the spice of life! Support your local microbrewery!




BREWHOGS 101 LIGHT LAGER 3.5%


MAD GIANT AMBER ALE 5%
